Old Car Spring Festival Promises Something For Everyone June 6-7

It is more than just an old car show... One of the biggest events that attracts people to this city is the Spring Festival presented by the Lancaster Old Car Club, Inc. which is held annually the first weekend in June on the Fairfield County Fairgrounds.

"There is always something for everyone—the entire family can be entertained during these two days," says Edson DeVore, chairman of the event. "Last year we had 22,000 people visit the show and we anticipate that many again. Of course, the weather is always a big factor," he added.

The 24th annual show will open with registration at 6 a.m. on both Saturday and Sunday, June 6 and 7. The show runs until 4:30 p.m. each day. Open to the general public, admission to the show is free with a \$1 parking fee on the grounds. Food concession stands will be operated by the club.

On Saturday at 10:29 a.m. the popular auto auction is scheduled. "Many outstanding bargains have been purchased from Ohio auctions. And many 'sellers' have found their vehicles bringing higher prices than they had expected," DeVore says. Peddicord and Associates starts the action.

The Civil Air Patrol will participate during the two day event.

Security will be provided on the grounds.

DeVore explained that for the past two years, a veterinarian from Juneau, Wis., has won the honor of traveling the longest distance to attend the show. He has indicated he will again attend this year.

"Cars come from all our neighboring states," explains Harold Greiner, co-chairman for the show. "Eighty cars are pre-registered already, and that is a few more than last year. Right now we are standing pretty good, it's all go if the weather holds," the chairman said.

Awards will be in 39 classes with three trophies per class.

There will be a church service at 9:45 a.m. Sunday on the grounds with Rev. Harold R. Sturm, pastor, Mills Memorial Methodist Church.
