Music Trivia:

An excerpt from “**The Incredible Band of John Philip Sousa**”, written by Paul Bierley (2006)

For John Philip Sousa's 1911 around-the-world tour, it took 352 days, 56 musicians, and 47,346 miles.

Obviously, a lot of this trip included lengthy boat rides and the band would practice on the decks of the ships if the weather was good.

When the band arrived at New Zealand, the trunk with all the Trombones went missing. Some local musicians offered to loan the band their own horns, which they did. However, the local Trombones were of a smaller bore and so the mouthpieces belonging to the Sousa Trombonists did not fit. Also, the New Zealand horns were not made the same (*were not built and tuned to the same frequency*) as the ones used by the Sousa musicians, and were pitched higher than the ones belonging to the Sousa musicians.

As a result, the Sousa musicians had to pull out the Trombone tuning slides to the max, and then had to use rubber tape to keep the slides from falling out. In spite of all this, the concert started on time.
