Many Activities Set for July 4 Event at Ashville

Additional plans and activities for the annual July Fourth celebration at Ashville have been announced.

The opening parade, the Little Mister and Miss event, is set for 7 p. m. July 2. Last year's winners, Little Mister Billy Tole and Little Miss Tonya Raymond, will be on hand to crown the winners. Also present will be the runner-up contingent — David Gloyd, Brian Herron, Connie Drummond and Rhonda Sue Harber.

All young entrants must be pre-registered by filling out blank forms that will be published. Committee heads said they hope to avoid registering the entries on the evening of the contest.

Judging for the Little Misters and Miss event will be held in the Community Park. The Teays Valley High School Band will present a 15-minute musical program prior to the judging.

THE Miss July Fourth parade and contests will be conducted on the evening of the third. Scheduled to crown the winners will be Miss Linda Benzenberg of Circleville, last year's queen. She will be accompanied by members of her court, Linda Pendleton of Columbus and Teresa Jackson of Circleville.

Entry blanks for Miss Fourth contestants also will be published. Judging will be conducted in the park.

Committee members said this year's floats will be required to participate in all three parades. Winners will be announced during the morning parade on July 4.

Other highlight entries in the July 4 parade will be miniature floats, pets, ponies and riders, ponies and carts, horses and riders, decorated cars, oldest cars, unusual entries and decorated bicycles and tricycles. Entries are to form up at 10 a. m. on Park St.

Fourteen bands have been scheduled to participate. Several of them will present concerts in the park.

Mayor Charles Morrison, committee chairman, announced that "The Music Clefs" have been scheduled for both round and square dancing nightly from 8 to 11:30 in the open shelterhouse.

park diamond; 3 p. m. — Pony Pull for 42" and 46" classes; 4 p. m. — antique auto race; 5 p. m. — sky divers, making three jumps over the ball field; 5:15 p. m. — Mosquito League game, both teams from Ashville; 6:30 p. m. — Entertainment by two local quartets, "The Metta Larks" and "The Two by Fours."
