and David Pontious are the last original members of the 1924 band that was directed by Fred Powell. At one point over the years, it is rumored that about half the band was made up of Hinton family members.

The latest director is the still-young James Connett, 85, of near Chillicothe. Connett tunes pianos regularly in Lancaster and has a rich music heritage. He taught high school in Athens, instructed music at Ohio University, and finished his career at Piketon at the age of 80.

Connett said he was asked to fill in as director in 1962 when the other director became ill. He's missed few concerts since.

With Connett at a spry 85, the ages in the band vary to a wet-behind-the-ears high school junior of 16. The younger folks are not discouraged from joining.

"All we ask," Pontious said, "is that a kid put out a little to play in the band. That's all". Auditions are unheard of and band members play their heart out for the fun of it.

"It's a good group of guys," Hinton said. "We've never had any trouble bailing guys out of jail. We've always been peaceful where ever we've gone."
