KINGSTON, OHIO, in Ross County about 20 miles north of Chillicothe, is celebrating the sesquicentennial of its incorporation as a village this year. Among its fund-raising preview events for the July 5-7 "Sesqui" celebration will be a June 10 Tour of Home and Village Landmarks, sponsored by the Kingston Area Historical Society.

A variety of homes spanning the 150 years of Kingston's existence will be open to visitors. Open will be a church founded in 1798, an 1800 tavern, a stagecoach stop, homes of pre-Civil War days, the Davis garage filled with antique cars and a modern home with lovely gardens.

If you get there at noon, you'll be able to visit all of the open spots, enjoy punch and cookies, watch an artist at work, listen to the Hillsboro Gospel Singers and the 104-year-old Adelphi Community Band—all by 5 p.m., when the event ends.
