will be conducted following the parade. The winner will receive a wristwatch. The first runner-up will be awarded a \$25 gift certificate and the second runner-up will be presented a season ticket donated by the Ashville Swimming Club.

Holland Featheringham, heading up an outstanding program of entertainment, has announced a pony pull, hog calling contest, pie eating contest and musical selections by a male quartet and the noted Metta-Larks foursome.

Additional entertainment on Friday evening will come in the form of a "Rock 'n Roll" dance starting at 8:30. The "Unknowns" of Circleville will provide the music.

On Saturday and Monday nights the "Arkedge String Busters" from Amanda will furnish music for round and square dancing.

Teams from the Ashville Mosquito and Little Leagues have scheduled baseball games Saturday afternoon. The Harrison Tap, Volunteer Fire Department will present a demonstration at 3:30 p. m. the same day. Another outstanding phase of the program will be a Vesper Service slated for 6 p. m. Sunday. The Rev. John Morgan of the EUB Church will be in charge.

DALE SCHIFF, chairman of the big parade on Monday, announced that several old and antique cars are due for appearances. He explained that all floats must be entered in all three parades, unless rain dictates otherwise.

Judging of floats will take place on the nights of July 2 and 3. Winners will be announced on the morning of July 5.

There will be three float classifications — commercial, senior class and junior class.

In the commercial class, the winner will receive a trophy and all other entries \$15. The senior division, which includes churches, lodges and civic groups, will offer prizes of \$75, \$50 and \$25 for first, second and third, plus \$15 each for all other entries. The junior category, to include youth groups, 4-H, Scouts and similar units, will feature \$50 for first, \$25 for second and \$20 for third, with all other entries getting \$10.

Prizes will also be awarded for miniature floats, pets, pony and rider, pony and cart, horse and rider, decorated car, oldest car (under own power), most unusual entry, decorated bicycle and tricycle. Three trophies will be presented in the classic and antique auto division.

Musical units listed so far to appear in parades and concerts are the Adelphi Community Band, Davis Demons Drum Corps, Centralia High School Band, Frankfort - Adena High School Band, Pickaway County 4-H Band, Teays Valley Cadet Band and the Teays Valley High School Band.

WADE CANTER, chairman of the Fish Fry stand, has ordered an extra amount of fish this year. This popular concession will be open each evening and all day Monday.

Highlight of the fireworks show, scheduled at 11 p. m. Monday, will be the action ground work display. Featured will be a pelican catching fish, according to chairman Orlan Hines. An additional amount of rockets will be added this year, he said.
