Old Car Club Festival Set On Weekend

Vehicles of almost every size and shape will converge on Lancaster Saturday as the Lancaster Old Car Club Inc. holds its annual Spring Festival on the Fairfield County Fairgrounds.

Co-chairman of this year's festival, Ed DeVore, reports antique, classic and custom vehicles from across the country will be vying for over 113 prizes in 30 classes at the two-day event.

Free admission and free parking at the festival make it one of the area's spring highlights.

This year's activities include: an antique auto auction in front of the grandstands at 1 p.m. Saturday (Peddicord Brothers auctioneers); grandstand entertainment including a flag ceremonial group from Rickenbacher Air Force Base, Columbus, the "Adelphi Old Timers Band" and the parade of steam engines and old cars at 3 p.m. Sunday.

DeVore says one of the largest flea markets in the area will also be in operation during the festival. He notes dealers must offer vehicle related items to take part in the flea market.

This year's feature car at the show is the custom built "Saturn Car." This vehicle was handmade by Bob, Lloyd and Don Templeton of Chicago, Ill., out of parts taken from numerous other autos.

DeVore and co-chairman Ernie Harter say they expect a record crowd of both participants and spectators this year. In 1975, over 400 antique autos participated in the show.
