Thirty-six classes of cars will be judged with \$2,000 in trophies to be awarded.

Church services will be held on the grounds at 9:45 a.m. Sunday.

The oldest original band in Ohio, "Adelphi Old Timers Band," will be featured Sunday.

An old-time filling station, circa 1930, built by Old Car Club members will be featured.

Admission to the spring festival is free. However, there is a charge for parking on the grounds. Soft drinks and food will be available.
