Plans for establishment of a new and larger Negro USO center in the former St. Mark's Episcopal church on South Walnut street were made at a meeting of the executive committee of the USO council with representatives of the Community chest, Thursday night.

Anticipating an increase in the detachment of Negro soldiers at the Veterans hospital, the need for larger quarters is serious, W. F. Goodell, associate regional executive of USO from Chicago, told the committee, headed by Ben M. Segal, USO chairman.

The Negro USO council will be reorganized and a trustee board will be called together next week to plan operation of the center.
