Charlie Barnett. A one-time Mead Corporation employe, he had resided in New York and Indianapolis.

He entered the service on Oct. 19, 1942, after working in an Indianapolis defense plant for a year, and was trained at Camp Croft, S. C. On Feb. 22, 1943, he went overseas to North Africa.

Helped Form Band

It was there, with Lt. Walter Cass, Denver, Colo., that he formed the 35-piece military band which took as its theme song the "Salute to the Stars and Stripes" which the father, Will Huff, had written during World War I. The copyright had been renewed by the son, and a second edition had just come off the press when he went overseas, taking a copy with him.

In addition, a 14-piece dance band was also formed in the unit and it frequently found its melodies going by short wave radio to South America.

Many Times In Hospital

Following his injury, he was returned to the States on Aug. 30, 1943 and received a medical discharge in November of the same year. However, he never recovered from the injuries and was hospitalized a number of times following his discharge.

Washington C. H. Firm Sued For \$756 By OPA

COLUMBUS, O., June 8 (AP)—The Columbus district Office of Price Administration filed a civil action suit in federal district court yesterday to recover treble damages of \$756.24 from the William Lucas Packing Co., of Washington C. H.

Willard D. Campbell, OPA district enforcement attorney, charged the firm on 17 counts with selling 3,819 pounds of beef at above-ceiling prices from Feb. 7 to March 29. The firm was charged on five more counts with failing to keep proper records, failing to register as a distributor with OPA, and failing to surrender meat points acquired in business transactions.
