Copper-Cloaked History Comes To Town Friday



Copper Cloaked history comes to town tomorrow for a two-hour visit in the form of a full-scale replica of the Liberty Bell which is here to stimulate the sale of U. S. Savings Bonds.

As an added feature of the Sesquicentennial, the bell will be on display at the telephone company's vacant lot west of Kroger's on Wheeling street from 9:30 to 11:30 a. m. Friday. The bell will be rung just once during ceremonies starting at 10:30 a. m. The program is to be broadcast by radio station WHOK and in which prominent local citizens will participate.

Paul Hyme, assistant personnel director of Anchor Hocking Glass Corp., will act as master of ceremonies and introduce Mayor Harold W. Brandon who will read a proclamation designating Friday as Independence Drive Day in Lancaster. Other speakers include Col. E. A. Silbaugh, Lancaster attorney, Dr. Robert K. Fox, president of Lancaster Lens Co., and John B. Lake, advertising director of the Lancaster Eagle-Gazette.
