Ohio Historical Society offers summer events

COLUMBUS — The Ohio Historical Center and adjacent Ohio Village I-71 and 17th Avenue, will offer unprecedented summer evening hours most Fridays and Saturdays from July 4 through Aug. 1, highlighted by 19th-century-style dinners, concerts and celebrations.

The center will be open 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and the village will be open from 12:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. Both sites will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, July 18.

At 7:30 p.m. on Fridays, July 17, 24 and 31, the village will offer The Great American Brass Band Concert Series, featuring old-fashioned outdoor musical performances. "Sunset Serenade," on July 17, will feature popular summer songs of the Victorian era, performed by the Adelphi Band, which has been in existence since 1880.

On July 24, the society's own Ohio Village Brass will play Stephen Foster tunes and 19th-century quadrilles and quicksteps during "The Victorian Gazebo." Popular Civil War songs will be featured during "Rally Round the Flag!" on July 31. The program features performances by the Saxton Cornet Band, whose members will be dressed in period uniforms and use authentic 19th century instruments.

Preceding each concert will be a full-course, Victorian-style dinner at the village's Colonel Crawford Inn. The menu will feature prime rib with all the trimmings and it is a reservation-only meal.

Saturday Summer Celebrations July 11, 25, and Aug. 1, will feature outdoor repasts from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., catered by the Colonel Crawford Inn. The village shops and buildings will remain open during these meals, which will be patterned after typical 19th-century picnics, barbecues and potluck dinners. A variety of music, games and craft demonstrations also are planned for each evening. Reservations are recommended.

"Early Settlers' Day and Homecoming Supper" on July 11 will feature a menu of fried chicken, potato salad, corn-on-the-cob, relishes, fresh fruit and homemade pies. On July 25, an old-fashioned barbecue with all the trimmings can be enjoyed during the "Family Reunion and Summer Barbecue." An actual Victorian-style wedding is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. The public is invited to attend.

"Harvest Home" on Aug. 1 will feature a buffet complete with a cornucopia of homemade breads, pickles, preserves and recently harvested fruits and vegetables.

Current hours for the center are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday and holidays. Current hours for the village are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday. The village is closed during the Ohio State Fair and on Wednesdays following Monday holidays.

Admission includes entry to both sites. Admission is half-price on Mondays and Tuesdays. For more information, or to make reservations, call the society's Scheduling Office at (614)297-2606.
