Laurelville Firemen's Old Time Festival begins activities tonight

LAURELVILLE — Five days of festivities begin in Laurelville this evening with the opening of the annual Laurelville Firemen's Old Time Festival. The formal festival dedication is scheduled for 7:45 p.m. The firemen's fish fry will open at 6 p.m. and carnival rides will begin operating at 6:30 p.m. Other events this evening include a gospel concert featuring the Gospel Harmony Boys, beginning at 8 p.m., and, available throughout the week, antique fire truck rides, midway games and other events. The festival continues through Saturday. On Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, the fish fry will begin at 5 each evening and the carnival rides and midway games at 6:30. Saturday's events begin at noon. Highlights of the Wednesday festival events include Little Miss and Mister and Junior Miss and Mister contests at 7:30 p.m. The Little Miss and Mister contest is for boys and girls ages 3-5 and the Junior contest is for those ages 6-8. Wednesday's events will be capped off with a talent contest and country music program, with disc jockey Jack Bartley serving as master of ceremonies. Thursday, the Miss Old Time Festival contest, for girls in grades 9-12 who live in the Laurelville fire district, begins at 7:30. A rock concert and dance featuring "Grooves Thang" begins at 9. Friday evening, Doug Jones and The Mark III musical staff will present country music shows at 8 and 10 p.m. Saturday activities include a firemen's water fight at 1:30 p.m.; country music with the Country Knights at 3 p.m.; a parade at 6 p.m.; Adelphi Band concert at 7; country music show featuring The Mark III, Alma Mea, Farrell Adams and Mike Cutright at 8; cake auction at 9:30 and a street square dance at 10. The cake auction is billed as featuring "Ohio's most expensive cakes." The top price paid for a cake last year was \$355.
