

# Logan Elm senior chosen Miss Volunteer Fireman

LAURELVILLE — A 17-year-old Logan Elm High School senior will reign over the remainder of the Laurelville Firemen's Old Time Festival, which runs through Saturday.

Troy Shriner was selected queen of the festival — Miss Volunteer Fireman — by a panel of four judges Thursday night. The judging was based on appearance, poise and personality. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Reed, Laurelville.

Selected as her first attendant was Sheryl Moore, 16, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Cecil Moore, Route 1, Laurelville. Second attendant is Ginger Short, 17, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Short, Route 1,

Laurelville.

The three will ride on a fire department float in the festival parade Saturday.

The judges viewed 13 candidates in the one-hour program. Miss Shriner was crowned by the 1972 queen, Kristie Wellman.

Tonight's schedule will include a musical program by the Mike Cutright Band, from Chillicothe, at the Main Street stage.

Saturday's festival events include a garden tractor pull, at noon at the baseball field; a muzzle-loading rifle shoot, 2 p.m. at the ball field; Ed Merriam, one-man band, 5 p.m. at the Main Street stage; festival

parade, 6 p.m., starting at the Laurelville Elementary School building; Adelphi Band concert at the main stage after the parade; a pony pull, 7 p.m. at the ball field; old time dress contest, 8 p.m., main stage; hog calling contest and cake auction, after dress contest at main stage, country-western music program, 9 p.m., main stage, and a square dance, 9 p.m., Foodtown Supermarket parking lot.

The parade is expected to match last year's 125 units. From 1-4 p.m., festival visitors will be admitted to all amusement rides for one price.

All proceeds of the festival go to operation of the fire department.
