## Laurelville Centennial Event Draws Record Crowd Of 3,000

A record crowd of over 3,000, the largest group of people ever to observe an activity in Laurelville, swarmed about the rural community of 600 last night on the fourth day of the village's 100th birthday celebration.

The main attraction at the grandstand was Flippo the Clown of WBNS-TV (Channel 10), Columbus. Over 1,500 people were packed into the area in front of the stage to watch

the star.

The Laurelville Karate Club announced record pie sales during the night's activities.

A full day of activities will conclude the celebration today.

A pony pull was to be held at 1 p.m.

A bicycle parade was scheduled for 2:30 p.m., to be followed by country and western music at 3:30.

Highlighting festivities tonight

will be the largest parade in Laurelville history at 6:30

Included in the parade are the Laurelville, Zane Trace and Southeastern high school bands, Adelpia Community Band, Laurelville Volunteer Firemen's float carrying the centennial kings and queens, at least one other float, queens from Nelsonville's Parade of the Hills, Miss and Little Miss Circleville Pumpkin Show and Miss Geranium from Kingston.

The Adelpia band will return to the bandstand for a concert at 7:30 and beard judging will be held at 8.

A square dance will be held at 9, as well as music by Bob Smart and the Travelers for those not wishing to dance.
