Clarksburg Field Day is set for Aug. 1

Clarksburg is getting ready for its 70th Field Day, Aug. 1, at the Field Day grounds on Ohio 138, one-quarter mile east of the village.

The annual event, sponsored by the Clarksburg United Methodist Church, attracts large crowds, including many former residents who come from a distance.

Many attractions have been planned

for all-day and evening, according to Ralph Goff, general chairman. The morning activities will begin with trap shooting, horseshoe pitching, and a flea market.

Concerts by two bands will highlight the afternoon program. The Adelphi Band, which has appeared on the Field Day program for more than 50 years, will give two concerts, one

from 1-2 p.m. and the other from 5:30-6:30 p.m. From 2-3 p.m. the Adena High School Band with the Adena Twirlers will present a concert. Scheduled from 3-4 p.m. are children's games and a greased pole climb.

The evening entertainment will be highlighted by two musical groups — The C&R Express (country rock)

from Washington Court House from 6:30-8:30 and The Pleasant Valley group of Columbus, singing the gospel in southern style, from 8:30-10:30.

Fish and chicken dinners will be served, beginning at 4:30 p.m. There will be fish and other sandwiches and refreshments available at various stands throughout the day and evening.
