# Thursday Youth Day At Ross County Fair

Two 4-H Style Reviews head the junior program for Thursday — Youth Activities Day — at the Ross County Fair.

First style review, for girls under 14 years of age, will be at 12:30 p.m. in front of the grandstand and the second, for girls over 14, will be at 7:30 p.m.

Feature of the senior grandstand program will be harness racing, beginning at 4 p.m. Racing sessions also are scheduled Friday and Saturday.

Thursday judging, scheduled to start at 9 a.m., includes sheep, open class dairy cattle, dual purpose cattle and open class swine. Open class sheep judging will be at 11 a.m.

Also scheduled at 9 a.m. is the Ayrshire Cattle Breeders District Show.

Cake decorating and ceramics demonstrations take place at 2 p.m. in the fine arts building.

The Adelphi Band will be on the grounds during the day presenting a concert at the bandstand at 1 p.m. and playing at the grandstand at 3:30 and 7 p.m.

The Junior Carverettes Drill Team will give a demonstration at the grandstand at 6:45 p.m. The day's activities will wind up with the Jerry Razor Dance-O-Rama at the grandstand at 10 p.m.

Highlight of the Wednesday evening program will be the open class horse show beginning at 7 p.m. at the grandstand. Rug weaving demonstrations are scheduled at the home arts building at 7 p.m. and FFA demonstrations take place the same time in the junior fair building.

Judging of beef cattle is set for 7:30 p.m. Wednesday.
