Fair in third day

Attendance above '71 levels

Ross County Fair attendance figures continued above the level of last year's figures for the second day Wednesday.

Single admission tickets were sold to 4,500 persons — 400 more than the second day last year — J. K. Rudell, fair board treasurer said.

Rudell said, however, the attendance was not record-breaking.

"It's just a very normal Ross County Fair. The weather's been good, everything's going very smoothly, and we're very happy about it."

Scheduled for today were: 9 a.m. — beef cattle judging fol-

lowed by showmanship; 12:30 p.m. — 4-H style review, junior division, and 4-H modeling demonstration; 1 p.m. — Huntington band concert; 2 p.m. — chair caneing and beef cattle open class; 2:30 p.m. — Huntington Band concert; 3:30 p.m. — Adelphi Band concert.

At 4 p.m. Pari-Mutuel betting harness racing will begin. At 6 p.m. the Blue Grass Pioneers will present a concert at the grandstand.

Class C horseshoe competition will begin at the horseshoe court at 6:30 p.m., and at 7 p.m. the junior fair sheep sale will begin.

The Adelphi band will perform again at 7:30 p.m. at the bandstand.

At 8 p.m. the Paint Valley Jamboree will begin at the bandstand, followed by the Dance-O-Rama at 10 p.m.

Friday events at the fair include: 8 a.m. — steer weigh-in; 9 a.m. — dairy cattle judging followed by showmanship; 1 p.m. — 4-H winning demonstration and Paint Valley Band concert; 2 p.m. — Cattle judging open class; 2:30 p.m. Paint Valley Band concert; 3:30 p.m. — senior citizen's band, Adelphi Band concert.

At 4 p.m. Pari-Mutuel betting harness racing will begin. A concert by the Paint Valley Band will take place at 4:30 p.m.

At 5:30 p.m. the Senior Citizen's Kitchen Band will play at the band stand. The next event will be the Class 'B' horseshoe competition at the horseshoe court.

At 6:45 p.m. the Adelphi Band will perform again.

At 7 p.m. the junior fair steer sale will take place.

Steer weigh-in for sale will begin at 8 a.m.
