Typical Clarksburg enthusiasm provided a day of fun and frolic for nearly 4,000 persons who flocked to the annual field day celebration Tuesday at Hurst's grove near the village. Gross receipts were \$2,618.05, an all-time high in the 40-year history of the field day which is sponsored by the Clarksburg Methodist church.

The program got under way shortly after noon, when 30 members of the Adelphi band gave a concert in the crowded assembly center. Fryer Timmons, master of ceremonies, introduced the speaker, Roy Battles, farm experi, who contrasted problems of farmers with the advantages of rural life.

After the speech-making, the kids engaged in various contests and enjoyed pony rides. The grown-ups enjoyed horsehoe pitching contests, a trap shoot, and looked over extensive commercial displays.

Persons came from miles around to see the evening program. The Adelphi band again led off, and the Rev. Thomas Taylor spoke briefly, praising all workers who aided in the success of the occasion. Raymond Stevens, a light-of-hand artist of Washington, C. H., gave a 45-minute performance. The Swasee River Boys sang spiritual and religious hymns, folk songs and a number of requested selections.

During an intermission the Sunset Rangers of Columbus, sponsored by the Fast Tractor Co., gave a program of instrumental music and songs.

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Tentative Blood Quotas Assigned to City Groups

Plants and organizations have been assigned tentative quotas in Ross county's revitalized war-or-peace Red Cross blood drive, Program Chairman F. L. Zellers said Friday.

Goal for the next visit of the bloodmobile, Aug. 24, will be 140 volunteers, Mr. Zellers asserted. This number should produce more than 100 pints of blood, allowing for the usual run of rejections.

The Red Cross regional center has asked each county to up its goal by 15 per cent to permit the stockpiling of whole blood substitutes for the military and possible homefront emergency use. The Ross county quota has been 100 pints.

Mr. Zellers announced tentative quotas Thursday afternoon following a conference with G. R. Williams, the vice chairman of the city campaign.

No quotas have been set for the county, the organization of which is in charge of Vice Chairman Ralph Batteiff.

While no direct call will be put on county dwellers for the Aug. 24 visit, they will have their chance Mr. Zellers said, explaining that a County Day for blood giving will be set, probably in October when farm activities are not so pressing.

Tentative quotas disclosed by Mr. Zellers are:

- U. S. Shoe Corporation plant 6;
- the Aluminum Cooking Utensil Co. plant 5; Mead, Corporation plant 25; Chillicothe Paper Co. plant 6; Veterans administration hospital 5; Federal reformatory 5; Government-police and fire departments, city council, post office and state highway total of 5.

In addition men's clubs and organizations (define quotas not yet fixed) are being counted on to furnish 15 donors, women's organizations 40, veterans' organizations (men and women) 20, Negro groups 4, and churches 10.

Mr. Zellers asked that group chairmen and committeemen complete their canvasses quickly and deliver contact cards to the Red Cross office, 121 West Main street, by next Tuesday. The contact cards should show individual time preference for giving blood, so that master schedules may be prepared in advance of the Aug. 24 collection.
