Clear skies and cooler temperatures gave the Ross County Fair the kind of break it needed Thursday as paid attendance came within 50 of 5,000 persons for the day.

This was a 1,350 increase over last year for the same day — it rained then — and provided a comfortable gain over last year's figure for the first three days.

## Holiday Inn Cooler Looted During Night

Hocking County Sheriff Paul Hartman said Mark Ebert, 9-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Roger Ebert, Laurelville was killed and his cousin, Terry Ebert, 4, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Ebert, Laurelville, was injured.

Terry was taken to Children's Hospital, Columbus. Both her legs were broken and she suffered possible internal injuries.

Sheriff Hartman said the youngsters were riding on the same bike on Thompson Ridge Road, a mile east of Laurelville when hit by a car driven by Mrs. Mariee Thompson, 32, Laurelville, Route 2. Mrs. Thompson was not held.

Roy Lee Osborne, 56, Laurelville, was killed in a truck accident Thursday afternoon on Route 194.

Pickaway County sheriff's deputies said the accident occurred about 18 miles north of Circleville when Osborne's truck hit a guardrail and overturned.
