Ross fair ends today

A good turnout is expected today for the final activities of the 1971 Ross County Fair.

Kenneth Rudell, fair board treasurer, said approximately 4,000 persons were on the grounds Friday — about 400 more than the same day a year ago. At present, attendance is running about 300 ahead of last year.

Tonight's feature attraction is a demolition derby beginning at 8 in front of the grand stand.

Other feature attractions of the day include the Class A horseshoe pitching at 6.

Prior to the demolition derby, the Adelphi Community Band will present a concert at the grandstand at 7:30 p.m. and Junior Fair Queen Karen Kensing and her court will be interviewed at 7:45.

At 8:30 p.m., a junior fair dance will begin at the junior fair building.

An eight-event harness racing program was to begin at 2 this afternoon. Several band concerts also were scheduled during the day by the Adena Adelphi bands.

A 4-H awards presentation took place at 11 a.m. and all exhibits were released by fair officials at noon.

Rudell reported the largest single day crowd for the fair so far this week was Thursday when about 4,800 persons were on the grounds.
