Everything Reported in Readiness for Start Of County Exposition

Five big days, the Fourth Annual Ross County Fair, open at the Route 104 fairgrounds Tuesday morning.

Feature of the exposition will be observance of Ross county's sesquicentennial on Friday, when a rural-urban dinner will be served and Gov. Thomas J. Herbert and his Democratic opponent, former Gov. Frank J. Lausche, will speak 20 minutes each to the grandstand audience, following an historical parade.

Exhibits in Place

The exhibits are all in place, the livestock barn and pens are packed with potential prize-winners, the midway has been enlarged and facilities added for the comfort of fair-goers.

Tuesday's program will be featured as "School Day" with the city, parochial and county schools occupying the center of attraction. The evening program will be featured with the appearance of Bill Morgan and a vocal group and will be concluded with a ball-bully show at the grandstand.

Wednesday will be Junior Fair day and will open with the dedication of the new junior fair building at 9:30 a. m. O. G. Haubell will be chairman of this program. Music will be provided by the Franklin Future Farmers of America. Address will be given by W. B. Wood Jr., dean of College of Agriculture, OSU, and more music will be provided by Patsy Toler of the Future Homemakers of America.
