Ross County Fair Opens Monday for 5-Day Run

Ross county's eighth annual fair opens Monday at noon at the fairgrounds, four miles north on Route 104. A bigger and better, exhibiting five days is promised by the county fair board and Charles J. Betsch, president and fair manager.

Fair directors, committees and exhibitors have been busy for weeks to make this an outstanding exhibition and Mr. Betsch declared Saturday that exhibits have been created comparable to the best of Ohio fairs, a symbol of pride in agricultural, commercial, educational, industrial, institutional and social progress.

On behalf of the board of directors, Mr. Betsch extended an invitation to all to attend the 1952 fair.

It is achieved, he said, through the co-operation of individuals working together for the betterment of all.

"The combined efforts of farm groups and urban neighbors and the wholehearted support given by every donor of time or money deserve the highest praise," he declared.


"Emphasis is placed on promoting wholesome character building youth activities and efforts are continually made to add or improve facilities and events which will provide for the participation and benefit of every group and interest in the county."

There will be the usual rides, games, amusements, musical programs, parades, demonstrations and fireworks (on Wednesday night) plus harness racing, rodeo, tractor pulling contest, professional wrestling and many other attractions.
