

### Second Day's Receipts Up Over 1949's

#### Coon Chase, Klein's Attractions Head Program Tonight

Wednesday was Junior fair day at the Ross county fair, but the expert exhibiting and enthusiasm shown by the youngsters, despite the terrific temperature, made them appear veterans of the first and fair-most magnitude.

Beginning at 8 a. m. with the lighting of 4-55 fireworks by Earl Whelan of Ohio State university, young Ross youngsters carried off time after time through the day with their prize projects in the fields of animal husbandry, fashion finery and health interviews.

An increase of 14 general admission entrants to the fair over last year's record marked the second day of the fair. Adult tickets numbering 3783 were sold as to the 1949, 1950 season tickets. Tuesday's total-tickets totaled 1054 adult and 518 season tickets. Children were admitted without charge both Tuesday and Wednesday.

Judging of horses by Thomas J. Kelly of New Lexington and the 4-H Boys show preceded the highlight of the afternoon, harness racing in which the daily double paid \$2140.
