## Ross County's Seventh Annual Fair Ready For Gala Opening on Tuesday

Ross county's seventh annual fair---heralded to be the best ever, will open Tuesday and run through Friday, under the direction of the Ross County Agriculture Society.

Among the major attractions will be three days of racing starting Wednesday, with three \$500 purse events, the 27 pace, free-for-all trot and the 27 trot; Thursday, three \$500 purse events, 2-year-old pace, free-for-all pace and 2-year-old trot, and Friday, three \$500 purse events, 24 trot, 25 pace and 22 pace.

There will be no betting on races.

The Gooding Amusement Co. will provide the amusement midway with riding devices, shows and concessions.

Music will be furnished by the Adelphi band, the Chillicothe and Frankfort High school bands, the Columbus and Chillicothe Salvation Army bands, and the Ross County Grange band.

A new stage has been erected in front of the grandstand and improvements made in the grandstand, including a better seating arrangement.

More space has been made available to displays and exhibits. New features will be the Central Ohio Shorthorn Breeders' Association show, a display of automobiles and trucks, U. S. Army and Navy displays, and a large showing of farm implements.
