No Signature Needed Under New Liquor Law

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)-After Oct. 23 you won't have to sign your name and address on order slips to buy liquor at state stores. A new law which becomes effective on that date eliiminates the name-address requirement now in use. State Liquor Director Richard Courch estimates that eliminating the slips will save the Liquor Department about \$55,000 a year.
