

Mead Party Expected To Draw 5,000

Plans Set For Labor Day Outing To Be Topped By Fireworks Display

Some 5,000 men, women and children are expected to participate in the Mead Corporation centennial celebration on Labor Day in Meaco park where an elaborate program of activities has been arranged, extending from 9:30 a. m. to 6 p. m.

Entertainment and refreshments at Meaco park close at 6:00, but at 9 p. m. the general public has been invited to join with Mead employees and their dependents in Yocotagee park for a mammoth fireworks display of more than 200 ground pieces and aerial shells.

Treats On Mead

Only Mead employees, their wives or husbands, and minor children or other immediate dependents are eligible for the day's program at Meaco park where each employe will be entitled to a fish lunch with soft drinks or ice cream for the kiddies—all as a "treat" by the Mead Corporation. In addition, all entertainment features, including the final day of swimming in the Mead pool, also will be free.

During the day, there will be various forms of entertainment and recreation, with suitable prizes, round and square dancing to the tunes of Hugh Jennings' six-piece orchestra, music by the Hallsville-Adelphi band, an old-time "German" band, horseshoe pitching, tennis, and an amateur hour.

To assist in the celebration of 100 years of growth and progress in papermaking, begun by his grandfather in 1846 at Dayton, George H. Mead, past president and now chairman of the board of the Mead Corporation, will make a 10-minute address prior to the baseball game between the Eagle Tools of Springfield and the Mead Papers at 1:30 p. m.
