

**CLARKSBURG EVENT
DRAWS 1000 GUESTS**

**Dr. J. Ira Jones In Address
For Field Day Program**

Despite the hot sun and oppressive humidity of central Ohio's current heat wave, nearly 1,000 persons gathered at Hurst grove, on the edge of Clarksburg, Thursday by 1 p. m. for the Clarksburg field day, with additional persons arriving throughout the remainder of the program.

Two members of the state highway patrol, R. E. Henderson and A. B. Cook, were present to direct traffic, with visitors arriving from Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Amanda, Chillicothe, Hartford, Williamsport, Atlanta, and other central Ohio towns.

Sixteen commercial exhibits were shown, sponsored by residents of New Holland, Williamsport, Hartford, Chillicothe, Atlanta and Clarksburg. The Adelphi 24-piece band presented a concert at 11 a. m., while Allen Tootle and Kenneth Crabb, both of Clarksburg, sponsored a bicycle race immediately following the concert.
