Another feature, new to the festival this year, will be an apple, peach and pear butter making project by the ladies of Chillicothe's Church of God during the entire festival. Mrs. Stanley said the group also will prepare old fashioned biscuits and home made bread.

The fourth annual festival is scheduled to open Thursday night, Oct. 15, with a queen contest and crowning at the Paxton Theater. The new queen will be crowned by the 1969 festival queen, Sue Granger.

The official opening of the festival, Mrs. Stanley said, will come at 1:30 p.m. Friday, Oct. 16, with the 1970 festival queen cutting the ribbon. The Bainbridge girl scout troop will act

as the color guard for the ceremony which will be held at the village's main intersection in front of the Paxton Theater. Mrs. James Krug is the girl Scout leader.

On Friday afternoon from 1-5 there will be special prices on midway rides for all youngsters, Mrs. Stanley said.

Friday night there will be a square dance on the Krug Dairy Queen parking lot. Among Saturday features already scheduled is a log sawing contest at 4:30 p.m.

To climax the event on Sunday, there will be a parade at 2 p.m., with a concert presented by the Adelphi Band immediately following the parade. Mrs. Stanley pointed out oth-

er features will be added as plans progress to make this year's event bigger than ever. She noted several groups have already made arrangements to operate food booths at the festival.

The groups are Nippen, Fruitdale and Lattaville United Methodist Churches, Shady Glen Mothers Club and Greenfield Police Department Auxiliary. The Bainbridge Church of Christ in Christian Union members will sell items made at the Chillicothe Veterans Administration Hospital.

The next meeting of the festival committee, of which James Krug is chairman, will be at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Sept. 14.
