Field Day crowd thirsty

CLARKSBURG — It took 2,500 gallons of soft drinks to quench the thirsts of more than 3,500 persons who attended Thursday's Clarksburg Field Day.

Sponsored by the Clarksburg United Methodist Church, the Field Day attracted an estimated 3,500-4,000 persons which is 200-300 more persons than attended last year's event.

The crowd consumed 475 pounds of fried chicken, 600 pounds of fried fish, 140 pounds of hamburger, 30 pounds of hot dogs and 150 loaves of bread before washing it all down with 2,500 gallons of soft drinks.

Gate receipts for the 62nd annual affair totaled \$884.75, or slightly more than \$50 more than last year. Profits from the event are used for maintenance and improvement costs for the church.

The Capital City Boys singing group from Columbus highlighted the evening's entertainment program which also featured the local Major Young Gospel Street music group. for the adults and contests for children were held. Results of the contests will be published in a future Gazette.

Concerts by the Adelphi community and Adena High School bands were also held along with a performance by Miss Donna Jean, a soloist from Bellefontaine who is a former resident of Clarksburg.
