Cryder honored for fair service

A new queen will be selected late this evening to rule over the 1984 Ross County Fair, as the pageant concludes the "official" opening day.

Ceremonies begin at 8 p.m. in the grandstand. Admission is 50 cents.

At this morning's kick-off breakfast, Wayne Cryder, the official honoree of this year's fair, was given a plaque for his 39 years as a member of the Ross County Agricultural Society. Cryder, who represented Colerain Township, is the last of the charter members of the society which was formed in 1945.

Cryder and James Hougland, another long-time member of the fair board, received lifetime membership in the society.

Quacky, the nearly 7-foot clown who will entertain at the fair all week, told the group that Ross has "the best county fair around." He also said he would guarantee that the

grounds would have a new building by next year's 41st edition.

Quacky also noted that he plans to become a citizen of Ross County just as soon as he sells his home in Toledo. "I'll either live in Chillicothe or Florida or live in Chillicothe and visit Florida," he said.

The official opening of the fair was held with the ribbon-cutting ceremony after the breakfast.

Events scheduled for today are the 4-H Style Review in the grandstand at 5 p.m.; the Zane Trace High School Band at 1, 2:30 and 4:30 p.m. at the bandstand; Mystic Moods Studio of Dance Revue at 5:15 p.m. in the bandstand; the Chillicothe Christian School Choir at 7 p.m. in the bandstand; and Bells and Beaus square dancing at 8:15 p.m.

Tuesday is 4-H Night. A calf scramble, hog-calling contest and greased pig contest will begin at 8 p.m. Tuesday in the grandstand.

A break-dance contest, sponsored by WFCB radio, will be held 7 p.m. at the bandstand.

Also scheduled for Tuesday is the 4-H Pony and Horse Show at 9 a.m. and the Junior Fair Rabbit Show at 10 a.m.

Horses, trailers, riders and spectators filled the grandstand in 80-degree temperatures at the fairgrounds Sunday as the Open Horse Show unofficially kicked off the fair.

Riders of all ages competed in 18 categories. The show was sponsored by The Ross County Horse Advisers 4-H Committee. All proceeds go to the advisers and then is turned over to the 4-H kids, according to Ann Admonius, president of the committee.

Either trophies, ribbons or cash prizes were awarded in each class. Trophies and ribbons were donated by sponsors throughout Ross County, and cash prizes were made possible through the entry fee.

There were 265 entries in 18 classes in the show.

Riders and spectators endured the heat, but one of the judges, Donna Price, had to sit out for the remainder of the competition after the 10th class because of over-exposure to the sun.
