Grandstand Events Highlight Program

Grandstand events highlight mission is free to both the grand-2 p.m. and the Paint Valley throughout the state. Jamboree performers at 5 p.m. Preceding the Queen Contest. Harness racing and the 4-H Style Revue head the list of grandstand attractions Thursday. Racing begins at 4 p.m. with a two-year-old trot, three-year-old pace and four-years-old and under trot on the program. Junior division of the 4-H Style Revue begins at 12:30 p.m. and is for girls under 14. The senior division revue is at 7:30 p.m. and includes girls 14 to 20. Also on Thursday's grandstand program are the Jerry Razor Dance-O-Rama at 10 p.m. and the Adelphi Community Band concert at 7 preceding the senior Style Revue. Friday, harness racing again is a 4 p.m. feature of grandstand activities and wrestling rounding off the Friday program at 8 p.m. Harness races slated feature two-year-old pace, three-year-old trot and four-year-old and under trot. The wrestling card features the Jolly Green Giants tag team. Reports indicate they were at one time members of the Columbus Colts football team. Rounding out the week's activities at the grandstand and the climax of the fair will be the fifth annual appearance of Stoney Roberts' Auto Thrill Show. The fast-paced show gets under way at 8 p.m. and includes not only auto fireworks, but the regular type as well. Also scheduled at the grandstand Saturday are two Adelphi Band concerts, one at 1:30 p.m., the other at 7 p.m., and the conclusion of the harness racing program. Saturday's races begin at 2 p.m.
