

# Junior Fair cattle sale tonight

The annual junior fair cattle sale will be one of the top events of the annual Ross County Fair. It will lead off activities at the fairgrounds tonight.

Kenneth Rudell, fair board treasurer, said about 100 head of cattle will be entered in the sale, which will be conducted by Scioto Livestock Co. at the sales ring.

The cattle sale follows on the heels of an afternoon harness racing program which is expected to attract an overflow crowd as it did Thursday.

The sale will precede a Friday night program of music and fire baton twirling at the grandstand. The music program opens with a concert by the Adelphi Band at 7:30 p.m. and features a "Shorty and Sadie" country music program beginning at 8 p.m. The fire baton exhibition will begin an hour later.

During the morning and early afternoon, various events and activities were continuing. These included horseshoe qualifying, basket weaving, sewing machine and cake decorating demonstrations.

For the third straight day, attendance Thursday, was reported up over 1968. Rudell said paid attendance was 4,318 persons, up 140 over Thursday a year ago. The net increase so far this year is 1,083 over 1968.

Rudell said fair officials were "more than pleased" with the turnout and noted even this morning's rainfall "helped, instead of hurt." The rains cooled off the grounds and is helping to keep down dust.

A number of activities and programs are scheduled to close out the 1969 fair Saturday.

Harness racing is to start at 2 p.m., a horseshoe tournament begins at 4 p.m. and activities will be climaxed by a Stoney Roberts Demolition Derby at 8 p.m. at the grandstand. A junior fair dance is scheduled at 8:30 p.m. at the junior fair.
