Senior, junior champs named at dairy show

The Ross County Fair rolled into high gear Monday with a flurry of activity as livestock raisers engaged in showmanship contests, agricultural officials judged contests and a queen was selected to reign over the 39th annual affair.

Bambi Corcoran of Chillicothe and David Clmer of Londonderry were named the overall senior and junior champions, respectively, of the Junior Fair Dairy Show. Corcoran, of Charleston Pike, is in the Town and Country 4-H Club. Clmer is a member of Jefferson Livestock 4-H Club and Southeastern Future Farmers of America.

Susan Rolf of Frankfort and Joe Wisecup of Lyndon won first place in the burrow carcass show in junior fair and open class competitions, respectively. Rolf belongs to the Concord Blue Ribbon 4-H Club.

Roger Crabtree of Greenfield took first place in both the Steer Carcass Show and the Beef Groom and Showmanship contest. He belongs to the Buckskin Ramblers 4-H Club.

Best of Shows were on display in 22 categories in the Home Arts Department in Building 12. The 4-H judges gave the top booth award to the Backroads Gang 4-H Club. And, in the event that attracted the most attention, Shelly Mather, an Adena High School graduate, was crowned Ross County Fair Queen by outgoing queen Karen Drummond, another Adena alumna.

Today is a big one for youngsters with swine, rabbit and poultry entries. Those and the 4-H baking entries are being judged today.

Afternoon and evening activities include music by the Southeastern High School Band at 2:30 and 4:30, the Adelphi Community Band at 3:30, Jim Berger at 5:30 and Pleasant Mountain Boys at 8.

Today is the opening day of harness racing, starting at 4. Class D horseshoe competition begins at 6:30 and the hog calling contest begins at 7.
