The Second Good Will Tour of Chillicothe Merchants, directed by The Chamber of Commerce, held yesterday, was one of the best trade tours yet held. The caravan left here at about half past one o'clock for Richmond Dale, where a concert was staged by the Old Folgers' Band, and Trade pencils were distributed to the schools. Thence to Vigo, where another concert was given, and on to Lonsdalebury, where again, the schools having been dismissed, pencils were given and in an intermission of the concert Myer Cole introduced Miss Doris Weistrick, one of the students at the High school, as "Miss Ohio" to the assembled visitors, who gave her an ovation.

From Lonsdalebury the tour led through Tucson to Adelphi, through the beautiful scenic Swamp Route, one of the most beautiful scenic drives to be found in southern Ohio.

At Adelphi the band gave a concert, and the merchants called on the local stores enroute many townspeople, and Hon. F. N. E. Redfern introduced E. S. Hovis as the speaker, and touchingly referred to the late Judge T. A. Minshall as one of Colerain's sons of whom all might be proud. Mr. Yank, in his address, further lauded the late Judge Minshall and presented the trade tour of Chillicothe as one of neighborly interest and exchange, stressing a warning to patrons their home merchants, rather than resorting to the mail order houses, and inviting all to come to Chillicothe to trade, where their own stores did not carry the stock they might want.

Mr. Redfern also brought out the fact that the Adelphi K. of P. fair would be staged again this year, and invited Chillicothe to show come out, saying Adelphi was going to bring their band to Chillicothe, where he was certain a warm welcome awaited them.

With this he introduced Mayor A. P. Minshall, who paid a very happy compliment to Adelphi, which he said had always been considered home by his father and the family of Minshalls. Mayor Minshall's address was devoted.
