The 4-year-old chestnut gelding placed only third and fifth in the two heats of the series run at the Hocking Fair Saturday, but had already sewed up the title in racing at the other five county fairs on the circuit—Athens, Jackson, Meigs, Lawrence and Washington.

Bengal Bangal had started the day with 71 points and wound up with a total of 85.

Marietta Time, a stablemate of the champ, was a distant second in the series with 60 points.

The Gooding Amusement Co. donated trophies for two of Saturday's races. Winners were Scott Mac, a bay gelding owned by William Miller of Piketon and driven by Bill Allen, and Capriole, a three-year-old bay mare owned by Hoy Fisher of Marengo and driven by Harry Fisher.

Other winners of the day were Graf Spec, owned by Tratovnick, Pollon, Topario, Chorskey and Eapers of Hopewell; Oakwood Mable, owned by Peggy Woolisan of Gambier, and R. Widower's Way, owned by Pauline Coe of Jeffersonville.

Uganda said today its air and ground units had recaptured three towns it claimed were seized by troops invading from Tanzania in a drive to halt the expulsion of Asians from the East African nation.

Tanzania denied its forces were involved but suggested Ugandans opposed to the regime of President Idi Amin were fighting troops loyal to him in southwestern Uganda.
