But the brilliant climax came at 5 p. m., when the Chillicothe trade caravan, wit' hand playing, horns tooting, claxons klacking, wound through the town, headed by a new motorized fire truck, Laurelville's pride, to pay the cost of which, fall festival revenue is to be used.
