"We're going to pull at the Lancaster fair, too," Jack Tarbill said, referring to October's Fairfield County Fair.

Festival events continue today in Stoutsville, with the grand parade at 10 a.m. Grand marshal is John Adams, who has been on the Clearcreek Township Fire Department — a volunteer department — for 30 years.

Also in the parade will be the Outstanding Citizens, Gene Hartley and Becky Ramey.

"Ever since we've had this, he has opened our fish booth, got that going. Anything we've asked him, he's here to do," Gilfillen said of Hartley.

Ramey, an auxiliary member for about 20 years, is a past president and secretary.

"She's up here at everything we have," Gilfillen said. "If the fire department gets called on a run and they're going to be out for a while, they call Becky and Catherine Hartley (another auxiliary member) to get food for the firefighters."

After the parade, visiting festival queens will introduce themselves on stage, and pets and bicycles will be judged. The baby judging contest, an event that drew more than 100 entrants last year, will follow at 11 a.m.

Other events of the day include a barbecue chicken dinner and fish dinner, tractor pull and queens luncheon at noon; Adelphi Band concert and bingo at 1 p.m.; sexy legs contest for men and women at 2:30 p.m.; hog-calling contest at 3:30 p.m.; open talent show for children and adults at 4:30 p.m.; and the Johnny Garber show at 7:30 p.m.

The festival ends at 10 p.m.
