

# Candidates' Day to Be Friday at Apple Show

JACKSON — Friday will be candidates' day at the 14th annual Apple Festival here.

George Bender, Republican candidate for U. S. senator, has advised festival officials that he will attend. All candidates attending will be introduced from the speakers' stand between 2:30 and 3 p. m.

Two parades also are on the afternoon's schedule, with the bicycle parade at 3 p. m. and the pet parade an hour later.

A crowd, estimated at 35,000, was on hand for the grand introductory parade Wednesday evening and the crowning of the festival queen, Edna Burton. Among those present for the coronation were Melba Finch, last year's queen, and Ruth Ann Valentine, queen of the 1953 Pumpkin Show at Circleville.

The parade included 75 units and required 45 minutes to pass a given point. In it were 20 school bands, Adelphi Community Band, three drum corps. There were about 1,250 musicians in all.

Three Chillicotheans served as judges of floats, C. S. Miller, Mrs. James Hatcher, and Mrs. Harold Rittinger. Winners were Kinnison Third Grade; American Legion; Kinnison Second Grade; Western Square Dance; and Kinnison Fifth Grade.

On schedule tonight is an amateur contest at 7:30 with Merrill Davis as master of ceremonies and free round and square danc-

ing from 8 until 11. Gene McKnight and the Happy Valley Boys from WSAZ-TV will provide the music for dancing with Slim Chapman of Hamden calling.

The Happy Valley Boys also will present a program from 1:30 until 2:30 p. m. Friday.

Five winners in the opening school parade Wednesday afternoon received cash prizes of \$50 and the right to take part in the grand introductory parade.

First prize went to the float of the third grade of Kinnison school. Other winners were Future Homemakers of America, second; sixth grade of South street, third; second grade of Kinnison school, fourth; and Tri-Hi-Y Club of Jackson High school, fifth.

Judges were Mrs. William Woodward, Mrs. J. R. Damron and Robert Amburger, all of Jackson.
