Adelphi


On May 19th, 1804 a copy of the original plat of the Village of Adelphi was submitted to the Recorder of Ross County bearing the following certification.

"Town of Adelphi"
"State of Ohio, Ross County"
"This day appeared before me, a justice of the peace for said county, Henry and Ruben Abrams, the original proprietors of the Town of Adelphi and acknowledged the annexed plan to be a true copy of original.


"Given under my hand and seal the 19th day of May, 1804 Cert. 6th of June, 1804

Just south of Adelphi is located the residence of Jesse Spencer, who operated the land office in this area during the early part of the century. The land office was a small building in the Northwest corner of the front yard of the Spencer home. Mr. Spencer came to Adelphi from Chillicothe, where he operated the land office. He died in 1840. Frank Cryder, son of George and Mary Cryder lived in the Spencer home for many years. The home was owned for more than 50 years by Robert Swineheart and at the time of the research by James O. Archer was owned by Russell Cox.
