Overflow Crowd Welcomes Governor John W. Bricker Here

in his Army address to an enthusiastic audience.
Because his promise to that effect two years ago has been fulfilled, he declares, Ohio is at the top of all the states in new industries brought in and in expansion of established businesses.

Here Also Speaks
The rally, sponsored jointly by the Ross County Republican Women's Club and the Ross County Young Republicans Club, also featured talks by Congressional Candidate Ray W. Davis of Chillicothe, who said he would welcome the

opportunity to discuss issues from the same platform with his opponents. (Congressman Harold K. Clayton), and by Mrs. Cova Jocelyn White, impromptu Negro speaker.
"Look to the record," the governor said, and he mentioned the savings during the first year of his administration. "And need the headlines of two years ago," he suggested, "but about the most, truckless tractors and graft in the liquor department. I want to report to you that the records are driven out of the state government and they are going to stay

out."
"It was not easy to save five and a quarter millions in the cost of operating the state government," Mr. Bricker said, particularly in the face of universal demands for more funds, but he ended last year with three and a quarter millions of operating surplus and no new taxes and no increase in taxes.
"The governor said his administration last year paid the schools 18 million dollars more than in 1938 and paid three million on the debt of the school fund, paid \$1,200,000 more to local subdivisions than the year before, paid \$1,200,000 more to local communities for relief than the year before, paid one and a half million on bond obligations, saved two and a half million on highways while building more miles of roads at less cost.

Of the Presidential candidate, Wendell L. Willkie, Governor Bricker said, "We welcome that leader who once was a Democrat."
