

CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR DUE AT 3 O'CLOCK

Pickaway County Democrats Saturday noon were preparing to greet Martin L. Davey, Democratic candidate for governor, when he arrives in Circleville at 3 p. m. He was scheduled to speak from the Court House steps immediately on arrival.

Democratic Chairman Carl Leist said Saturday that he had still received no report concerning the personnel of the Davey party, but said it would be either John McSweeney, candidate for United State senator, Dennis Dunlavy, candidate for Supreme Court Judge, or William Kennedy, unsuccessful candidate for governor in the primary election.

County Democratic candidates may be introduced at the rally if time permits, while music will be furnished by the Adelphi band.

Either Saturday afternoon immediately after the Davey Party leaves for Chillicothe, or Saturday evening a series of sound films, showing phases of the government's conservation and agricultural program, may be seen at Democratic Headquarters on South Court Street. Morris Boggs, East Union Street, Mrs. Elizabeth Davison, West Franklin Street, and Miss Martha Miller, North Court Street, will be in charge of the Democratic offices.
