KINGSTON — Residents are preparing for Saturday's third annual Kingston Fall Fest, a combination of music, food and competition.

The event is sponsored by Kingston National Bank, said Helen Kellenberger, the bank's executive vice president.

- 4 and 5:30 — The Goosetown Astorians.
- 5 — The Zane Trace High School marching band.
- 6 — A 5K run begins in the park. Participants of all ages may sign up before the race.
- 6 — A old-time car "cruise in."
- 7:30 — The Yellowbud gospel group Harmony Four.
- 9 — Square dancing begins and continues until midnight.

Winners from the various competitions will be announced at 8, Kellenberger said. Prizes are being donated by various Kingston merchants.
