



OHIO HISTORY DAY WILL BE NEXT SUNDAY

Fine Program Will Be Given
At Logan Elm Park Off
Scioto Trail.

The annual meeting of the Ohio History Day Association will be held at Logan Elm Park, six miles southeast of the city next Sunday. Many persons make an all-day affair of the meeting, bring their lunches and get a full day of enjoyment.

With the Scioto Trail open from Columbus and from Chillicothe to the park it is expected that a large crowd will attend the meeting. The Scioto Trail south of the city has been closed during the entire summer for paving and has only recently been opened to travel.

The highway is in splendid condition with the exception of the grade at the Norfolk & Western railroad tracks in S. Court-st, which hasn't been repaired.

The park is on the list of accredited camps which assures plenty of good drinking water.

A fine program has been prepared for the entertainment.

J. F. Carlisle, vice president of the Ohio History Day Association, will preside at the meeting. The program will open with invocation followed by an address of welcome by Mayor B. T. Hedges. A presentation of a flag donated to the association by Phil Weber, Canal Winchester, and presented by George F. Bareis will then be made.

This will be followed by a salute to the flag and "The Star Spangled Banner" by the band and the audience. Remarks will be made by Harlow Lindley of the Ohio State Archeological and Historical Society.

The address of the day will be presented by Randolph Walton of Columbus. Music will be furnished by the Adelphi band.
