Famed Program Set Sunday By History Society

Saltcreek Township School In Charge At Logan Elm

A program revered by historians all over this section of the nation is set for Sunday—rain or shine.

It will be the 42nd annual celebration of the Ohio History Day Association. And plans have been made as usual to hold it in the shade of Ohio's most famous tree, the big Logan Elm a short distance south of Circleville.

The program will be in charge of Saltcreek Township School, and activities are scheduled to start at 2 p. m. In the event of rain, the program will be held in the school's auditorium.

Saltcreek School is located on Route 56 a short distance east of Circleville. Logan Elm Park is about seven miles south of the city, approximately one mile east of Route 23.

PARKING AND picnic facilities are available at the scenic spot. The park is administered by the historical society, which was founded in 1912 at Circleville.

Sunday afternoon's program will open with a concert by the Adelphi Band, followed by the devotional by the Rev. Richard McDowell of Laurelville.

The Pledge and Salute to the Flag will be by Dale Drake. Carol Ann Spangler will recite Logan's Speech, and then music will be
