Laurelville's Fall Festival Opens Tuesday

Laurelville's fall festival will be held at Laurelville Tuesday, Oct. 1, through Saturday, Oct. 7, under sponsorship of the vounteer fire department.

Fire Chief Hugh Poling said net proceeds, as in the past, will go toward purchase of needed fire-fighting equipment.

The festival gets under way at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday. Rides have been set up in Laurelville's public square and several side streets by the Fred Nolan Amusement Co. of South Zanesville.

Wednesday night's festivities will include the crowning of a Firemen's Queen, at 9 o'clock and a concert by the Laurelville High School band. Two queen candidates from each Laurelville High School class have been nominated.

Climax of the festival will be a parade starting at 5 p.m. Saturday. The Laurelville High School band will head the parade, which will include the Firemen's Queen and her court, old autos, horses and their riders and bicyclists. Prizes will be awarded for the best decorated horse and saddle and bicycles.

The Adelphi community band will present concerts Thursday and Saturday evenings and the Laurelville band will present its second concert Friday evening.
