...and these followed until midnight. Toward the last he suffered severe pain, but the administration of chloral hydrate gave him quiet and he fell into a sleep from which he never awakened, the end coming at half past two this morning.

Death was due to the hemorrhage induced by the violent retching caused by partial asphyxiation, which must have ruptured several blood vessels in the stomach.

The deceased was born November 24th, 1850, at Macedon, Wayne county, New York, the son of Luther and Clarissa (Ripley) Hathaway. The family moved to Marietta in 1853. Mr. Hathaway was married in Marietta June 3, 1875, to Annetta Morse. After leaving school he was a surveyor, and later in June 1876 he located in Portsmouth, where he entered business as a photographer with A. A. Fuller. He came to this city in 1885 and opened a gallery, his high class work at once appealing to the public.

He is survived by his wife and five children, Mrs. E. W. Kenhofer and William Hathaway of Portsmouth, Luther and Gilbert and Frances Hathaway, who are at home. A brother, Seymour J. Hathaway, of Marietta, is well known here.

The deceased was a member of Chillicothe Lodge No. 52, B. P. O. E., and

had served that lodge as its exalted ruler.

The funeral arrangements have not yet been made, pending advices from his brother, Mr. Seymour J. Hathaway.
