LABOR HOSTS ARE ALL SET FOR MONDAY

*Expect a Throng of 5,000
Persons at Yocangee
Park on That Day.*

5000 persons are expected to attend the Labor Day celebration of the Central Trades & Labor Council, at Yocangee park here next Monday. Arrangements to take care of this number of visitors were reported to have been completed at a special meeting of the committeemen and members of the Labor Council, held in their headquarters in the Majestic Building last night.

Activities under the direction of the organization, however, will start tonight when their new dance floor, erected in the city park, will be dedicated with a platform dance.

The Program

Committee chairmen reported that every detail has been arranged for. At 10:30 in the morning athletic events will begin. At 11:30 a halt will be called for an hour and a half, to give those on the grounds a chance to spread their picnic dinners.

Then at 1:30 activities will resume, with addresses by Congressman Mel G. Underwood and L. S. Newman, Columbus labor official, taking an hour. At 2:30 dancing will start as well as resumption of athletic feature events, which will last until 5 o'clock. A basket supper from 5 to 6:30 will pave the way for the final band concert of the season, which will open at 7 o'clock. The program is:
