Hallsville fest this week

HALLSVILLE — The horse show has gotten bigger, but as always, the 19th annual Indian Summer Festival will benefit the Hallsville Community Center.

The event runs from Thursday evening to Sunday afternoon.

Shows and competitions of horses and mules will be featured, along with the traditional fare of the Adelphi Band and the princess pageant, said Mim Courtright, vice president of the non-profit association that oversees the 15acre center.

This year's goal is to pay off the remaining \$4,000 owed for center lighting and to buy a used tractor to tend the grounds.

Last year organizers netting nearly \$5,000, which was used to

create a baseball diamond and to buy lighting, she said.

Saturday offers a car show, with ribbons awarded for the top cars. The parade later that day has 78 groups participating. All events are free.

A Chinese auction will allow visitors to bid on craft items from vendors. The center is just east of Hallsville on Ohio 180.
