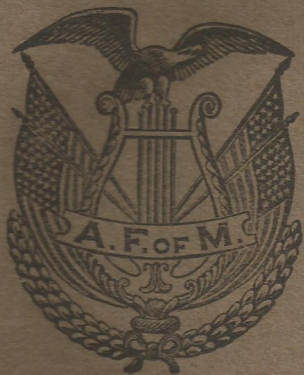

**Constitution and By-Laws of the Chillicothe Federation of Musicians**  
**Local 524 A. F. of M.**

---

**ARTICLE 1—Name**

This association is and shall be known as the Chillicothe Federation of Musicians, Local No. 524 American Federation of Musicians of Chillicothe, Ohio.

**ARTICLE 2—Object.**

The object of this association is to unite the Instrumental portions of the profession of music; to establish a wage scale of prices below which its members are not permitted to work; and to promote the best interests of the association in general.

**ARTICLE 3—Officers.**

The Officers of this Local shall be, President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer combined.

**ARTICLE 4—Executive Board.**

The Executive Board shall be composed of President, Vice-President and Secretary.

**ARTICLE 5—Terms of Officers.**

All Elective and Appointive Officers shall hold office until their successors are duly elected or appointed and installed.

**ARTICLE 6—Voting.**

Only members in good standing can vote.

#### ARTICLE 7.—Membership.

All musicians over 16 years of age, recommended by the Examination Committee can be elected to membership.

Application for membership must be made on regular blanks, adopted by the American Federation of Musicians, must be forwarded with the initiation fee of \$5.00, and the proportion of the year's dues, either for 3, 6, 9 or 12 months, whichever part of the year is yet to come at the rate of \$2.00 per year. This \$2.00 per year dues is always payable in advance, and every leader, or manager of any organization should see that their men's dues are paid in full.

A member in good standing in another local of the American Federation of Musicians wishing to become a member of this Local must comply with the laws of the American Federation of Musicians, but no one shall be a full member until the full membership fee of this Local shall be paid.

#### ARTICLE 8—Fines.

Any member of this local who shall allow his dues to remain unpaid for one month, and who fails to pay same after two weeks notice from the Secretary, shall be subject to a fine of \$5.00 and will

be suspended from the local, and will not be allowed to play with members of this local in good standing.

#### BY-LAWS

This Local adopts the Constitution and By-Laws as amended and adopted at the 25th Annual Convention May 10-15, 1920, all rules cover this Local the following rules in particular: Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the American Federation of Musicians.

#### RESOLUTION

### **THEATERS**

One Performance, Leader \$3.00; Men,  
\$2.00 each.

All Extra Performances at same rate.

When play six days with Sunday extra,  
Sunday figured time and half.

### **AMATEUR THEATRICALS**

Same as theater prices, half price for  
each rehearsal.

### **VAUDEVILLE SHOWS**

Shall not be less than theater prices  
and price to be governed by number of  
acts and extra shows above three per day,  
as per agreement with managers.

### **PICTURE SHOWS**

Same as theaters and vaudeville, with  
\$1.00 per hour after 10:30 p. m. or frac-  
tion of hour, when one performance, but  
never less than \$18.00 per week for six  
days, time and one half for Sundays  
extra.

### **DANCES**

8.00 to 12:00, \$5.00 per man, shorter  
time, figured same rate. All dance work  
after 12 p. m. \$1.50 per hour or fraction  
of hour. Out of town work \$7.00 per  
man, with \$2.00 per hour after 12 p. m.,  
plus expenses.

## CONCERTS

Commencements, Banquets, Weddings, Parties, Afternoon or evening, 3 hours or less, Leaders \$3.00, Men \$2.00.

## HOTELS

Two hours playing or less, Leaders, \$2.50; Men, \$2.00.

## BANDS

Two hours or less, when in evening, Leaders \$3.00, Men \$2.50.

Four hours or less, Leaders \$4, Men \$3.00.

Eight hours, or over four hours, Leaders \$8.00, Men \$6.00.

Three sessions, morning, afternoon and evening, Leaders \$10.00, Men \$8.00.

Prices by week same as above figured by day.

Country picnics where no marching, \$5.00 per day.

Extra heavy playing, managers and leaders are allowed to charge above these prices and to always charge all extra expenses in both band and orchestra work.
